Communication Skill Development Practice – Students Centric Practice

2) Goal:

To achieve effectiveness in Teaching and Learning process, Based on this the best practice was continued to improve the communication skill and competitive spirit among the students to enhance the communication and face the global challenges present now.

3) The Context:

Ever ending changes and development taking place in technology is one of the major issues that affect Teaching / Learning process. Rural students find it difficult to keep pace with modern Techno learners. The facilitator is required to use variety of tools to keep the learner motivated in the learning process. Interaction with others in effective manner. Using language and methods. A challenge faced by the facilitator is to keep pace with latest modern tools and practice.

The Teaching and Learning process is given great importance in the institution. The institution trains its facilitators continuously to help to them enhance their learning capabilities. The learning imparted to its teachers is put to practice in leading to enhanced quality in students.

4) The Practice

Communication Skill enhancement process starts with designing of lecture plan by the facilitator, After working hours the faculty members conduct special classes – four hours a week in their respective specialization subjects Resource persons are also invited. The objective of the Lectures is to specify to the learner the learning outcomes. During the Lecture & discussions questioning is encouraged .Various forms of assessments are used for continuous evaluation such as group discussions, assignments, power point presentations, Class test. This practice gives opportunity to the students and encloses them to converse well.

Another important aspect in Teaching /Learning process is to develop competitive skill among the students to face the competitive examinations and to equip placements themselves to get. Even ideas that sound in practical are discussed and proper guidance is given to the learners. Training along with the learning process is imparted. Learner is the part of learning process but not just a spectator.

MOU's and tie-up arrangements with different industrial and service sector units which help the students to get job after completion of their education. The learners also avail the Language Lab facility in the institution which also add to enhance their communication skills and employability.

A major limitation of this process is the time constraint as the facilities have various ideas which they would like to implement in their special classes. However due to paucity of time the target may not be reached.

5) Evidence of Success:

The evidence of success is visible qualitatively as well as quantitatively. The qualitative indicators are more positive outlook towards life improvements in etiquettes and desire to understand things better than learning. The quantitative indicators are evinced in Sugar, Textile, NGOs Software sector like as Wipro and Infosys . Some students have applied the same to their own businesses.

The results bring some prominent to light. Some of the factors are students when shown the right direction and are given proper guidance and encouragement can achieve the goals they set. Holistic development rather than only academic success contributes in creating socially sensitive individuals is a prominent expectations of educational institutions.

The non- availability or non-workability of technology is one of the major problems encountered in the Teaching and Learning process. Further learners interest and the needs may not be fulfilled.
